....and welcome to the world of colour! CHEMSET® products, as well as being manufactured in Kent, England are top quality epoxy resins. The business started in 1969 when we supplied the 'Rag Trade' in London cold enamel for matching buttons to fabric. The system was developed by our M.D. Mr Bright and our first order was for 1 pint! The business blossomed from there with competitors coming and going along the way. We are however constantly striding forwards, investing, developing and setting the standard.

These products can be used to decorate the surface of metal, glass, ceramic and many other materials for use in jewellery, model making and lots of other products.

The enamel consists of 2 main parts; a resin and a hardener, to this colour effects may be added.

There are two different types of resin and hardener and they must be used in the correct combination. The mixing ratio remains the same for the different types, this is 2 parts resin to 1 part hardener by weight.

"Type A resin must be used with Type A hardener."

"Type B resin must be used with Type B hardener." Mixing ratio: 2:1 Resin: Hardener by weight





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The different resins

There are several different resins, each make up enamels with different characteristics. Here is a quick guide to help you decide which to use. For more detailed information on the resin, please go to it's dedicated page.

Important Information

Always stand the plastic cups containing the mixed enamel on a protective surface, preferably metal. This is because the enamel begins to set about 45 minutes after mixing and during this time a chemical reaction is occurring which may generate a lot of heat that can melt the cup and damage your

working surface.

to mix you will need to prepare your working area by protecting the surface with disposable sheets and have other cleaning things ready to use during your enamelling.

Be careful of your work area and clothes when using the enamels as they will be difficult to clean if they come in contact. After you pour from the cans you should wipe any drips with a rag as a build up of these drips will prevent the lid from going back on.

The enamel and its components are irritants so protect your hands with Travabon Special Cream which will stop the enamel from sticking to your hands. Always wash your hands (and any other areas of skin that come in contact with the product) thoroughly with soap, do not use solvents or thinners.

What you need

Scales - Very important, the easiest way to mix the enamel to ensure the best results.

Mixing cups - Best to use plastic disposable cups. They can be re-used then thrown away when they get too messy.

Mixing sticks - Wooden lollipop sticks work best. It is better to mix the enamel with a broad blade than a thin stick.

How to mix

- **1.** Place the cup on the scales. Re-zero the scales.
- **2.** Pour the amount of resin you want into the cup (may include colour paste).
- **3.** Pour the hardener into the cup.
- 4. Stir carefully until fully mixed.
- **5.** Apply enamel to the surface.





Standard Resin (CHEMSET® ES 8102)

This is a clear, liquid resin and is our best seller. It is more colour-stable and domes very well because of it's thicker nature.

It can be used to enamel over patterned, printed and other types of surface.







"Type B Resin for use with Type B Hardener"

Mixing ratio is 2 parts resin: 1 part hardener by weight

It can be used as a resin to embed objects and/or be used with the silicon mould to create 3D shapes. It can also be used to magnify if it is domed over text or images.

Opaque Colour Pastes

The pastes are not resin, they can be added to any resin mixture but must not exceed 5% of the total resin weight. The Opaque Colour Pastes can be used in this mixing ratio with both Type A and Type B resins and hardeners except Superglaze, Intense Black and Intense White.

Fluorescent Colour Pastes

These pastes are not resin; they are similar to the opaque colour pastes but are added to the resin in a slightly different way.

You can add up to 10% of the fluorescent colour paste to the resin but when calculating the 10% you can include the hardener weight as well. Can be used with both Type A and Type B Resins and Hardeners.


These colours 'glow' under a 'black' (UV) light and are best applied over a white background.

The Transparent Resin looks best when the light can shine through it. By creating an outside edge and sticking it to acetate, it can be filled with the enamel. The dried enamel will peel off the acetate and stick to the metal edge allowing the light to shine through the enamel.

Sparkle Resins

The sparkles are suspended randomly in the resin so will keep a consistent glitter effect and will not sink to the bottom or float to the top. These resins need to be mixed with the hardener only, they should not be diluted as this will affect the sparkle.

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Metallic and Pearl Resins

The special pearl effect is suspended in the resin allowing you to create your own pearly waves on the surface. By using a pin or paperclip, make swirls and lines to create your unique pearl effect. These can not be diluted as it will affect the pearl and metallic particles.

The Satin White Pearl Resin (CHEMSET® ES 8541) can be tinted with a small amount of the transparent colour resins to create your own pearl colour.

Glow-in-the-Dark Resins

The Glow-in-the-Dark resins contain particles of pigment which do not dissolve in the resin but are held in suspension. These particles absorb light and emit it again. They need a good exposure to light to take on a good charge.

These 'colours' all look white in their jars but you can add a few drops of transparent, opaque or fluorescent colour to the Glow-in-the-Dark resins to give them colour for daytime use. Do not add too much colour as this will affect the absorption of light.


Thixotropic Resin (CHEMSET® ES 8124)


This resin is to be used with the Thixotropic Hardener (CHEMSET® ES 8221). The resin is designed specifically to be used on curved surfaces. It forms a thick enamel that 'sticks' to the surface and does not run off the edge or to the sides.

The Thixotropic enamel looks better when coloured as it is not entirely clear.

This resin can be made thinner by using the Type A Hardener (CHEMSET® ES 8204) instead of the Thixotropic Hardener. If even less viscosity is required, the Thixotropic Resin can be blended with the Low Viscosity Resin (CHEMSET® ES 8103).

Low Viscosity Resin (CHEMSET® ES 8103)

A low viscosity version of resin that is suitable for large areas and mixing with other resins. Low Viscosity Resin can be blended with Thixotropic Resin and the Transparent Resins, it can also be coloured with the Opaque Colour Pastes. For areas over 5cm squared use this resin for better results. Tease out the edges with a pin or straightened paper clip.

Mixing ratio is 2 parts resin: 1 part hardener by weight

Hard Resin (CHEMSET® ES 8106)

This is an extra hard liquid resin which is used when a flat, non-domed, surface is required. It can be sanded down when fully cured, has a lower tendency to clog the abrasive paper and it is easier to polish.

Superglaze Resin (CHEMSET® ES 8110)

This resin is designed to be used over white backgrounds, it gives a very bright effect and does not fade. It cannot be used with any colour pastes due to the way it 'bleaches' the colour to give the white effect.

This resin is often used on badges and keyfobs to make them look brighter and stand out.

Mixing ratio is 2 parts resin: 1 part hardener by weight





Intense Black (CHEMSET® ES 8510) & Intense White (CHEMSET® ES 8511) Resins

These enamels give a very intense colour due to the colour being ground straight into the resin part of the mix. They do not allow the colour of the background to show through the enamel. They are designed to be these colours only so are not ideal for changing.

"Type B Resin for use with Type B Hardener"

Mixing ratio for the Intense Black is 2 parts resin: 1 part hardener by weight

Mixing ratio for the Intense White is 5 parts resin: 2 parts hardener by weight, as shown on the table opposite.





Flexible Resin (CHEMSET® ES 8115)

This is a Type B resin to be used with the Type B hardener (ES 8203). This was designed to be used on fabrics, paper, plastic etc to be entirely flexible. It can also be poured into a mould to create a 3D flexible or soft feeling enamelled piece.

It can be used with the Opaque colour pastes, using the guidelines on page 7 for the resin component, to give it colour.





"Type B Resin for use with Type B Hardener"

Please note that the mixing ratio of the Flexible Resin is 5 parts resin to 2 parts hardener by weight as shown on the table below.

Type B Hardener (CHEMSET® ES 8203)

This hardener gives a clear, bright surface of superior gloss and appearance as well as superior resistance to humidity.

For use with type B resins.



Type A Hardener (CHEMSET® ES 8204)

Similar to CHEMSET® ES 8203 but for use with type A Resins.

Mixing ratio is 2 parts resin: 1 part hardener by weight



Fleximould (CHEMSET® AP 1401)

The Fleximould allows you to make moulds to create various cast shapes. It comes in two parts that have to be mixed together in equal quantities by weight.

Part A is White and Part B is Blue, when they are mixed correctly an even, translucent pale blue colour will be created. The Fleximould is workable for 40-50 minutes and it sets in about 6-7 hours.

When set the Fleximould remains slightly flexible allowing you to easily remove the casting.





Mixing ratio is

1 part base : 1 part catalyst

by weight

Mould Release (CHEMSET® AP 1401)

A brilliant product that is a best seller. Can be used on a variety of materials to stop the resin from sticking.

This product is sold in an easy to use pump spray bottle. Only a very small amount should be applied to the surface of the mould for easy to remove action.

Ideal for use with, for example, chocolate and icing moulds to produce intricate mouldings for use in jewellery and craft applications.



Remember, all of the resins available can be used for casting as well as enamelling and using the mould release opens up a whole new world the world of casting!

Hobby Resin (CHEMSET® EZ 7401)

This resin has been designed for the first time user to try out as it is measured by volume NOT weight.

Use a spoon or small pot to measure 2 parts of resin and then 1 part of hardener. You should still be accurate with your measurements and all other points that apply to the other resins apply to this one as well.

Once you are happy using resin we suggest you move to our other resins and the measuring by weight method as volumetric resins do not give as consistently good results as the normal range.





Aqueous Cleaner (CHEMSET® AP 1120)

This non-flammable cleaner can be used for cleaning the uncured enamel from your tools and equipment.



Epoxy Stripper (CHEMSET® AP 1105)

Epoxy Stripper acts by swelling the cured enamel, reducing it to a crumbling mass which can easily be wiped off metallic objects.

Skin Protection Products

Epoxy resins and hardeners can cause skin irritation. We recommend the use of Travabon Special Cream or Lindesa to protect your hands whilst working. After work, hands can be cleaned with soap and water but we strongly recommend the use of Cupran, Slig or ResSolve.



Curing procedures

After the resin and hardener have been mixed together you will have approximately 45–60 minutes to use it. The amount of usable time will vary according to the amount of material you have mixed and the temperature of the room.



Hardening will occur overnight (16 hours) at room temperature. The room temperature should not be allowed to drop below 18°C during the curing process.

You can cure the material in a curing cabinet, at 30°C to 40°C, which will accelerate the curing time and permit handling within 2–3 hours. This will also prevent dust settling on the surface.

Should air bubbles be present prior to curing these can be removed by wafting the flame from a gas burner briefly over the surface.
